



The Mid Week Rylstone Dumpling Run

Wednesday 7th May 2025



McGraths Hill to Rylstone and return via Gardens of Stone, Glen Davis.

Our mid week culinary experts have come up with a menu suggestion for a tasty home made Yum Cha at a picturesque heritage country cafe in Rylstone.

Calling all S.M.S.F. Devotees, early and late retired Alfisti, weekend workers, and any one else who wants to join the run and can confirm their attendance by 1st May as our booking is restricted to 33 attendees due to Restaurant size in inclement weather.

Jim Roseby and Peter Berger have devised and surveyed the planned route and found the traffic to be light, the B55 to be in good condition. The Kandos-Glen Alice-Glen Davis road has been paved and improved from two years ago when we last ventured that way. In case of any roadwork or pothole damage, they will survey the drive in the week before the 7th May, for an up to date road report.

Rylstone offers plenty of offstreet parking next to the "29 nine 99" cafe at 28 Louee Street. Some great views of the northern escarpment of the Gardens of Stone National Park on the good road surface from Glen Alice to Glen Davis will be enjoyed in the afternoon light.

Departure time from the McDonalds carpark on the cnr Winsor Rd and Groves Ave, McGraths Hill will be 8:30a.m. Expected arrival time at Louee St Rylstone is 11:30 am.

Intermediate stops may be the Lolly Bug, Hartley around 9:20/9:40, as well as a possible comfort stop offering well priced 98 Fuel (Shell Reddy & Pearl) on the Great West Highway Lithgow. Fuel for the return trip can be from United at Marrangaroo and ULTRA at Kandos.

The plan is to wrapup the Yum Cha around 1:00 for the scenic return run to Windsor which should take around 3hrs 20min.

Driving distance for the day is about 370 klm, or 231 miles, depending on your odometer calibration.
