SHOW & SHINE JUDGING RULES

All that is required for display in a model class is a reasonably clean and tidy car, drive up and enter on the day. Judging is only carried out on the visible exterior of the cars.

- 1. Only current financial members of an AROCA state club may enter a vehicle.
- 2. The entrant must be the registered owner of the vehicle.
- 3. The judging methodology is fairly informal and based on external condition and presentation.
- 4. Only volunteer current financial members of an AROCA state club are eligible to be appointed as a judge.
- 5. The windscreen display card must be completed for the car to be eligible for judging. If no card is displayed, then that car will be considered not eligible for judging.
- 6. The decision of the judges is final. Where there are less than 3 entrants in a class, then the number of awards is reduced to the number of entrants less 1
- 7. Vehicles will be classed in the categories listed on the vehicle display card.
- 8. Enjoy the day!
